On she mo The	April 26, 2013, an infant was found face down, wedged between his mother and a chair, not breathing. The mother stated fell asleep with the infant while feeding him. Another adult entered the home and found the infant non-responsive. The ther stated she was taking prescription pain medication at the time of the infant's death. The infant died from asphyxiation. The agency learned of this incident via the local news, contacted law enforcement, and filed a report on 4/29/2013 alleging glect to the child by the child's mother. A criminal investigation is pending.
