A Child in Need of Protection and Services petition filed on February 18, 2016 for the child expired on September 1, 2016. At the time of the incident, the child and two of his siblings continued to receive voluntary, in-home ongoing case management services. Additionally, the child's 4 year old brother was in foster care under a Child in Need of Protectiction and Services petition. The last contact by the agency to the mother was at a court hearing on September 9, 2016.

The agency collaborated with medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the child by the child's mother. The medical professionals reported that the child's critical medical condition was a result of chronically poor control over his medical condition. The child was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with a treatment foster care provider. The agency determined the other two children in the home were safe and they remained in the care of their mother. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.
