Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the infant's alleged father. The agency also found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate neglect to the infant by the infant's mother. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained various bone fractures that were inflicted in more than one trauma event. The infant and the infant's 1-year-old sister were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a licensed foster home. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
