The Medical Examiner's Office determination and toxicology results are pending. The agency initially determined the infant's sister to be unsafe, and initiated a Protective Plan on September 28, 2018. The agency subsequently determined the infant's sister to be safe, and the sister remained in the home with her parents. The family was referred to community support services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
