On May 16, 2012, the agency deemed the now 7-year-old half-sister to be unsafe, took Temporary Physical Custody, and filed a Petition for Protection or Services. The court placed the now 7-year-old half-sister in the home of a relative and the case remained open for ongoing services.

On February 9, 2012, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 7-year-old half-sister by their mother and the half-sister's father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On November 17, 2011, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the child's now 7-year-old half-sister by their mother. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On November 12, 2011, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the child's now 7-year-old half-sister by their mother. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 7, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 5-year-old half-sister by their father and the half-sister's mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The family was referred to community services and the case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On January 9, 2014, the agency screened-in a Services Report. The agency provided the family with services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment

completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the 3-year-old child and his 9-month-old half-sister by their mother. The 3-year-old child and his 5-year-old half-sister and 9-month-old half-sister were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
