The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate neglect to the child by the mother. Physical abuse was also substantiated; however, a maltreater could not be named. Although the mother denied any

,	wrongdoing, she admitted she did not seek out medical attention for her child. The child was removed from the mother's care and placed in the care of the father. The family continues to receive ongoing case management services.
