The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained head injuries and diagnosed the infant with Traumatic Brain Injury, as well as extensive bruising on the back, abdomen, buttocks, and extremities. The infant and his sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a foster home. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
