Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On June 1, 2016, the agency received a report regarding a 10-month old infant pronounced deceased in his home. Law Enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation into the infant's unexplained death. The Medical Examiner's Office report noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The official cause of the infant's death was undetermined by the Medical Examiner's Office. Toxicology results are still pending. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, but the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate the allegations of physical abuse to the infant by the mother or the father. The agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegation of neglect to the infant and his siblings by the mother and the father. The deceased infant's two oldest siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a group home and the deceased infant's youngest sibling was also deemed unsafe and placed with relatives. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
