At the time of the incident, the 2-year-old child was in her mother's care under a trial reunification and the agency was offering services under a Child in Need of Protection or Services Order. The last contact by the agency prior to the incident was November 21, 2017 with the mother.

On July 21, 2015, the agency screened-in a CPS Report. The agency was unable to complete the Initial Assessment because the family could not be located.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the 5-year-old child, the 2-year-old child, and 1-year-old infant by their mother. The agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect to the 1-year-old child and 1-month-old infant by their mother. The agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the 3-year-old child and 1-month-old infant by their mother. At the time of the incident, the 2-year-old child was in her mother's care under a trial reunification. The other children resided in their home with their mother. All five children were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed in a foster home. Children in Need of Protection or Services Petitions were filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
