Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:  On March 29, 2018, the agency received a report regarding a 4-month-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical personnel determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.  Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment
completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater and to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by her mother and father. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries that were non-accidental in nature. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a licensed foster home. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed on behalf of the infant on April 12, 2018 and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services. The infant's 9-year-old sibling was deemed unsafe and a Protective Plan was initiated to allow the sibling to remain safely in the home with the sibling's biological mother. The 9-year-old sibling continues to reside primarily with her biological mother with supervised contact with her father.
