Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.				
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the infant by the infant's mother and neglect to the infant by the infant's father. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the infant sustained injuries that were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant's 1-year-old sister was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care with relative. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
