On September 19, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant by her mother and father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The agency and family agreed to an Informal Disposition Agreement and the case was opened to provide ongoing case management services.

On August 6, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 1-year-old brother by the mother and neglect to the infant and her now 1-year-old brother by the mother. During the assessment period, an additional CPS Report was received and screened-in on September 19, 2018. The initial allegations of physical abuse and neglect were unsubstantiated.

On June 26, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's 1-year-old brother by the mother and father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On June 21, 2018 the agency screened-in a Services Report. The family was referred to community services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father. The father was criminally charged and court ordered to have no contact with the infant and the infant's siblings. The infant and her 1-year-old sibling were deemed safe and the children remained with their mother. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
