The Initial Assessment completed by the jurisdiction from another state found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the child by the mother and father. The child's siblings were determined to be unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed in a non-relative foster home. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
