On May 22, 2020, the agency received a report regarding an incident that occurred on April 26, 2020, in which a 14-year-old child, a 16-year-old child, and a 17-year-old child were pronounced deceased in their home. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined that the 14-year-old child, 16-year-old child, and 17-year-old child died as a result of a serious injuries. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the 14-year-old child's father, who was also the 16-year-old child's step-father and the 17-year-old child's uncle, was criminally charged with multiple counts of First-Degree Intentional Homicide, multiple counts of Use of a Dangerous Weapon, and one count of Possession of a Firearm-Convicted of a Felony. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.					
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the 14-year-old child, 16-year-old child, and 17-year-old child by the 14-year-old child's father. The Medical Examiner's Office determined that the 14-year-old child, 16-year-old child, and 17-year-old child died as a result of a serious injuries. The agency determined the 3-year-old nephew of the 14-year old child, who was residing in the household, safe and the child remained with his mother. The family was referred to community services and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
