Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On August 29, 2021, the agency received a report regarding a 12-year-old child and an 8-year-old child brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. The 12-year-old child was pronounced deceased at the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries and death to be non-accidental in nature. As a result of Law Enforcement's investigation, the children's grandfather was charged with 1st-Degree Intentional Homicide, Physical Abuse of a Child, Repeated Acts Causing Death, Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death), and Physical Abuse of a Child, Repeated Acts w/ High Probability of Great Bodily Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the 12-year-old child and 8-year-old child by the grandfather. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries and death to be non-accidental in nature. The 8-year-old child and his siblings were deemed safe, and they remained with their grandmother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.

On August 13, 2019, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of physical abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
