On April 4, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response regarding unborn child abuse. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On September 12, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS report alleging neglect to the infant by the mother. The infant died during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's death on October 16, 2022. An assessment of the allegation was completed by the agency, and the initial allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated.

On March 28, 2022, the agency screened-in a Services Report. The agency did not refer the family for services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother and the father. Medical professionals noted no signs of trauma to the infant; the autopsy report is pending. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
