On December 18, 2020, another agency screened in a CPS report alleging neglect to the child by the mother and the half-sibling's father and neglect and physical abuse of the child's now 6-year-old half-sibling by their mother and the half-sibling's father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On September 11, 2020, another agency screened in a Services Report. The family was provided referrals to financial and medical support services.

On January 10, 2020, another agency screened in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child and her now 6-year-old half-sibling by their mother and the half-sibling's father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect of the child's half-sibling by the mother and the half-sibling's father was substantiated. The allegation of neglect of the child by their mother and the half-sibling's father was unsubstantiated. The case was opened for voluntary services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother's boyfriend and neglect of the child by mother and the mother's boyfriend. Medical professional determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The child was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. A petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
