Is it true that if foster parents are doing something that leads to extinguishing a higher level behavior that we count that child as having a higher score due to the necessary behavior on the part of the foster parent?



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Rate the child, not the child in services!



Should birth parents ever be chosen as the "considered" Identified Permanent Resource? Wouldn't a birth parent be "primary" if reunification to the birth parent is the Primary goal in the Permanency Plan?

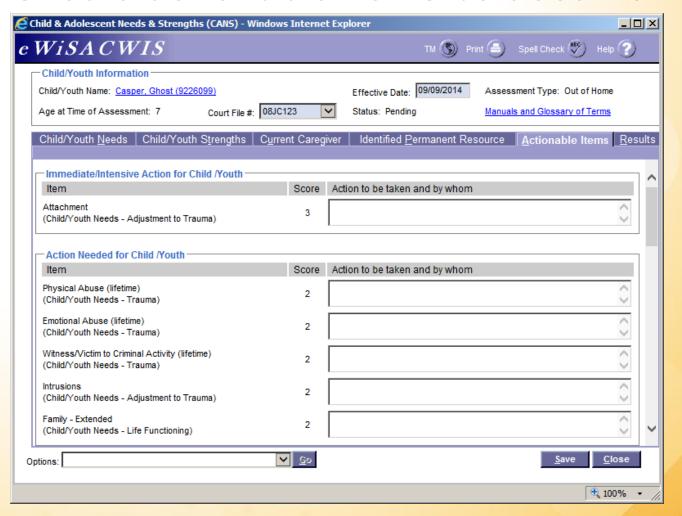
What if there are two different parents in two different households that are both listed as IPR and both moving toward reunification?

How should actionable items be documented?





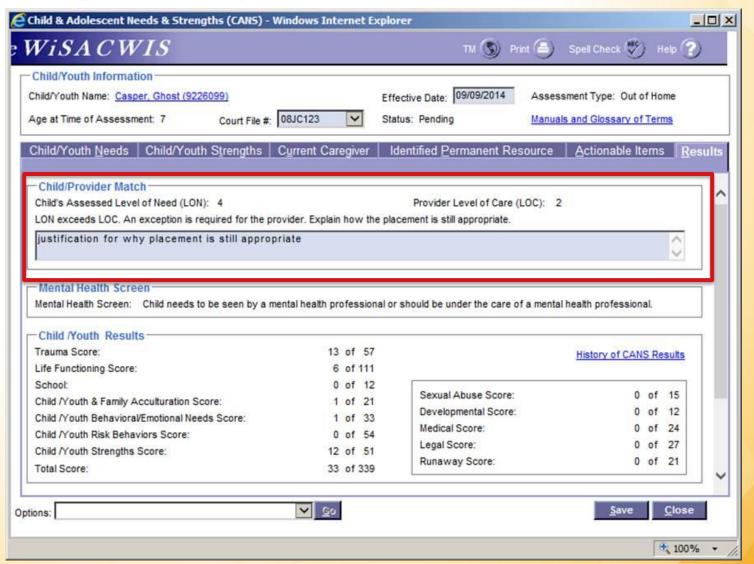
Can a child with a LON of 4 be placed in a Level 3 home?

When scoring the current caregiver or an identified permanent resource, are those items rated in relation to the child or are they rated in general for that provider?



How should abuse/trauma be rated when there is no confirmation it occurred? What about a youth who gets into physical altercations with their birth parents? Is this physical abuse?



Can you define Family – Nuclear and Family – Extended, especially for post-TPR cases?



If a child is being bullied – they are the victim and it is causing stress in their life in many life domains – where should this be rated? Under Exploited? Under Social Functioning – Peer?



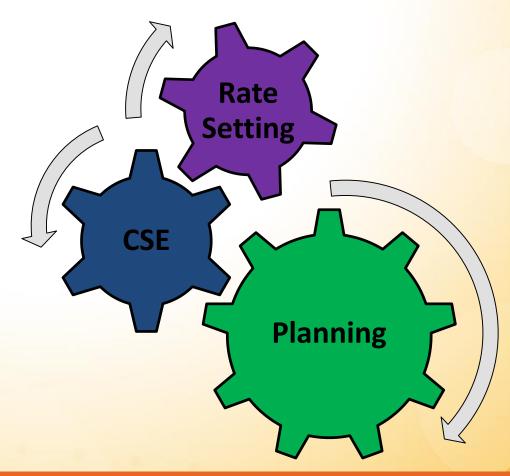




What information from the CANS will prefill into different documents in eWiSACWIS?






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What happens when the LON is greater than the LOC?

The CANS effective date should be the date of the placement, correct?



For instances where a child is going to be moving from a highly restrictive environment, such as an RCC, to a less restrictive environment, such as a Level 1 foster home, how do you rate the items with a 30-day window, as this would not accurately reflect the child's needs? For example, a child who sexually assaulted a younger sibling while at home would not really have the opportunity to do so in an RCC with the level of supervision and restriction.



When is a CANS required to be completed?

Within 30 days of placement in a GH or RCC

Algorithms

The CANS provides results based on three algorithms. Not every item rated is used for each algorithm. The results for each algorithm will be calculated by eWiSACWIS and the results will be shown either on the CANS Results tab or the Foster Care Rate page.

Level of Need (LON): is the recommended placement level for the child based on their identified needs and strengths. The
LON does not prescribe a placement for a child, but makes recommendations (please see the Placement Complexity
Matrix).

- Mental Health Screen: states whether or not the child needs to be seen by a mental health professional.

- **Supplemental Rate:** calculates the supplemental portion of the foster care rate based on ratings of '2' or '3' on specific items. The supplemental portion of the foster care rate is calculated by adding up the items rated a '2' or '3' and multiplying them by the supplemental rate multiplier.
