- Captures information related to services provided by Independent Living Programs for youth who are eligible for Independent Living Services during the reporting period
- Provides summary data on how many youth are eligible for services, how many are receiving services, and documentation compliance

- This report does not determine the youth's eligibility. The youth's eligibility history is system generated at the time of the approval of the youth's out-of-home care placement. Eligibility determination can be found on the youth's permanency plan.

■ Tickler

- 45-day countdown from youth's 17th birthday
- Deleted within two weeks after survey completion (every other Friday/Monday)
- Not related to IL program eligibility

■ IL Page: Outcomes Tab

- Reasons for non-completion
- Survey completed box
- Completed survey download

Outcomes Survey Implementation Work Flow

1. Worker accesses FosterClub website: www.fosterclub.com , a National network site for foster youth
2. Worker facilitates youth membership on FosterClub website.
3. Youth completes his/her profile
4. Click on NYTD Link for youth to complete survey using youth's eWiSACWIS *Person ID #*

■ Engaging Youth

- Opportunity for youth to communicate how they are doing.
- Opportunity for them to impact positive change in child welfare.
- Key for success:
 - ✓ Good contact information
 - ✓ Membership on FosterClub
 - ✓ Relationships forged prior to leaving care
 - ✓ Ongoing communication after leaving care
 - ✓ May need to offer various methods for completion

eWiSACWIS

Frequently Asked Questions

- What case is the IL plan tied to?
 - The plan will be tied to all cases the child is listed as a participant in.
- What impact does the end date have on services data?
 - All services should be reviewed at the time the Perm Plan is updated (every six months) and end dates must be indicated for services not being provided.
 - All services will default to an end date when the youth's case is closed.
 - New services must be entered for youth ages 18-21.

Outcomes Follow-Up Population Ages 19 and 21

- Automated as much as possible from Foster Club at age 19 and 21.
- Youth will complete survey on own unless assistance is needed from county agency.
- eWiSACWIS Report will indicate who should complete the survey and who has/has not.
- If survey not completed within 90 days, county agency is responsible to follow-up with youth.

What We've Learned

- Survey Completion: Rates of Success
 - An agency designee facilitates survey completion.
 - Run on demand SM08X103 a few weeks in advance.
 - Registration on FosterClub done in advance of completing the survey (between age 15 and 17).
 - One method does not work for all youth

What We've Learned

- What is the data showing us?
 - 622 surveys were completed during the FFY
 - 73% of the youth that completed a survey have services documented in eWiSACWIS
 - 70% of youth state they emotionally feel close to their family
 - 30% of youth have been referred for AODA issue
 - 14% of youth are employed
 - 2.5% of youth are incarcerated

eWiSACWIS

Frequently Asked Questions

- Who gets the ticklers?
 - The primary worker automatically gets the IL ticklers for the child. However, if the tickler needs to go to the IL worker or other designee, that can be done through Tickler Management.

eWiSACWIS

Frequently Asked Questions

- There are youth listed on our SM08X107 that shouldn't be.
 - IL Report Logic:
 1. Looks for county that created the IL record
 2. If no IL record documented > looks for county case where youth is a household member
 3. If youth is documented in the household of more than one case > most recent placement.

eWiSACWIS Frequently Asked Questions

■ Example

- Youth is removed by county A
- An IL record was not created prior to leaving care
- Default to the county of household the youth belongs to (If household moves to county B, but youth remains in county A > Youth shows up as a county B youth)

■ Resolution

- Communicate with County A; make change on IL page.

eWiSACWIS

Frequently Asked Questions

- How many days do I have to complete a survey on a youth that comes into care 30 days after his or her 17th birthday.
 - 15 days
- What if that youth returns home on the 40th day?
 - Youth remains part of the baseline population.

eWiSACWIS

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Is it necessary to get a parental release for minors to complete the survey?**
 - The data collection required by NYTD is not considered a research activity that is subject to the Federal regulations for the protection of human subjects. Therefore, there is no specific Federal requirement or procedure to seek informed consent.
 - However, agencies are encouraged to develop their own procedures to ensure that youth understand the purpose and use of the survey, including that it is voluntary. A consent form could explain the study and gives the youth clear decision-making authority regarding their participation, and if worded in a youth friendly manner, may actually assist in garnering the participation of youth in the NYTD survey.
 - Distribute NYTD Flyer

Frequently Asked Questions

- On the IL contacts tab—it has spaces for email and secondary email contact info but how does it get entered?
 - The email addresses can be entered on the child's person management page on the address tab. It will prefill to the page when it is saved. If the child is in a placement, the worker will have to wait until the child is no longer in the placement as the address is "frozen" when a child is placed. Option: Put the child in the Other Collaterals section in the meantime.
