

# eWiSACWIS 4.4 Highlights

Topic	Incident Number and Description
<b>Access</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(30695) A large change will be made that affects CPS Reports and Services Reports. Workers will no longer have the ability to flip back and forth from a CPS Report to a Services Report in eWiSACWIS. To help accommodate this change, workers will have the option to create either a CPS Report or a Services Report from the Create menu on the desktop. Additionally, workers will be given the ability to copy over information from a screened out CPS Report to a new Services Report. This will support standards and provide more accurate reporting. Furthermore, the language on a Services Report will be changed to more accurately reflect the specific content of a Services Report.</li></ul>
<b>Adoption Assistance</b>	<p>(31205) This change will affect any user attempting to document an Adoption Assistance Agreement where there are applicable exceptional adoption needs. Four new elements will be added to the Adoption Assistance Agreement page to allow the documentation of an agreement with exceptional adoption needs. These elements are: Age (10+), Child at High Risk, Member of a Minority Group, and Sibling Group (3+ Placed Together). Checking any of these will allow a user to continue with the creation of an Adoption Assistance Agreement and will allow a user to select an Adoption Subsidy Type of "MA w/Subsidy Amount."</p>
<b>Assessment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(29039) A change will be made to the Assessment page that will aid in the accurate documentation of alleged maltreaters. Workers will no longer be able to select the value of "Unknown Unknown" in the Alleged Maltreater drop-down if the relationship to victim is a known relationship (i.e. biological parent). Furthermore, the Relationship to Victim values of "Minor(s) not named - Primary," "Minor(s) not named – Secondary," and "Minor(s) not named - Non-caregiver" will be added. If the relationship to victim is any of these values or has the value of unknown, then and only then can "Unknown Unknown" be selected as the Alleged Maltreater.</li><li>(29684) The risk ratings on the Initial Assessment - Primary will be removed, as they are no longer needed as a part of the initial assessment process. Please note that the Family Service Level will be removed in a future release.</li></ul>
<b>CANS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(29297) New pages will be added to eWiSACWIS to view the Child &amp; Adolescent Needs &amp; Strengths (CANS) history for a child. The history of CANS results will allow you to see all CANS for a child. Additionally, CANS results will be viewable in graphs. These results can be viewed by the child's assessed level of need, the total CANS score, or each individual CANS module. The information for these graphs can be viewed by different timeframes (all CANS, those completed for the current out of home placement episode, those completed for the current out of home placement, or those that exist in a custom timeframe).</li></ul>
<b>Maintain Case</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(30713) Several changes will be made to the Maintain Case page to accommodate the 2012 BMCW reorganization. A new Designation field will be added to the case information to indicate if a case is designated as "Intensive In-Home" or "Permanency Support." An associated Details flare will also be added for the Designation field. Additionally, on the Participants tab, a user selectable check box (Rsp) will be added next to each active case participant to indicate whether or not the agency has responsibility for that individual.</li></ul>

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<b>Person Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(22501) New fields will be added to the Basic tab of the Person Management page to accommodate multiple languages spoken by the person. This change is being made to accommodate the languages foster parents speak which in return are used to find appropriate placement matches for a child.</li></ul>
<b>Provider</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(22501) In an effort to combine the Multi-Purpose Home Study Report and the Child Specific Home Study Report, a new Home Study page will be added to eWiSACWIS. In addition, a new Home Study Update/Recertification page will be added. With these new pages, new templates will be added.</li><li>(22501) A "Receiving Care" field will be added to the Members tab of the Home Provider page to document provider members that are receiving care (as defined by Wisconsin Administrative Code DCF 56). This information will also be used in the Multi-Purpose Home Study Report and Multi-Purpose Home Study Update / Recertification.</li><li>(30713) On the Home Provider page, the Lcns. Type field will have a new list values of: BMCW, Child Placing Agency, County, Out of State and State Adoptions. Additionally, the Lcns. Agency field will no longer be a user entered text field and instead users will get a preset list of values to choose from when they type in the agency name (or part of name). The Lcns. Agency values will be based on the Lcns. Type. Furthermore, the Licensing page will have a new field added that will display the Licensing Agency that was selected on the Home Provider page.</li></ul>
<b>Subsidized Guardianship</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(31205) This change will affect any user who works with a Subsidized Guardianship family. The main element of this change focuses on the documentation of subsidized guardianship eligibility into eWiSACWIS. Per July 2011 policy, eligibility for the subsidized guardianship program needs to be established before a subsidized guardianship agreement can be created. This change will provide a new page for users to document and track all eligibility determinations for a given child in Subsidized Guardianship. This includes an initial determination, annual reviews, and changes in circumstances. This eligibility determination is specific to Subsidized Guardianship and only controls the eligibility of participation and payment generation within this program.</li></ul>
