MONTHLY OUTCOME MEASURES FOR 2006-2007 OF THE 2006-2009 W-2 AND RELATED PROGRAMS CONTRACT

The monthly outcome measures have been established as a way to monitor services based on successful outcomes for the W-2 participants the agency serves. Each Agency was required under the 2006-2009 Contract to submit a projected outcomes chart indicating the number of W-2 participants who will benefit by each specific outcome on a monthly basis for 2006-2007

All reports will be done monthly.

The attached chart shows the five monthly outcomes that will be measured for BOS and CMA Agencies, and the four monthly outcomes for JDPAs Agencies. Specific outcomes measured include:

- Entered Employment;
- Average Wage at Placement;
- Individuals Remaining Employed over Six Months;
- Individuals Obtaining Employment during or within 60 Days of Completing Job Skills Training;
- Approval of Supplemental Security Income/Social Security Disability Income (not applicable for JDPAs)

Because the monthly outcomes are based on successful outcomes per W-2 participant there is no adjustment process, one case credit or zero case credit.

Note: The Department reserves the right to prospectively revise the outcome types or earning amounts at any time during the contract.
