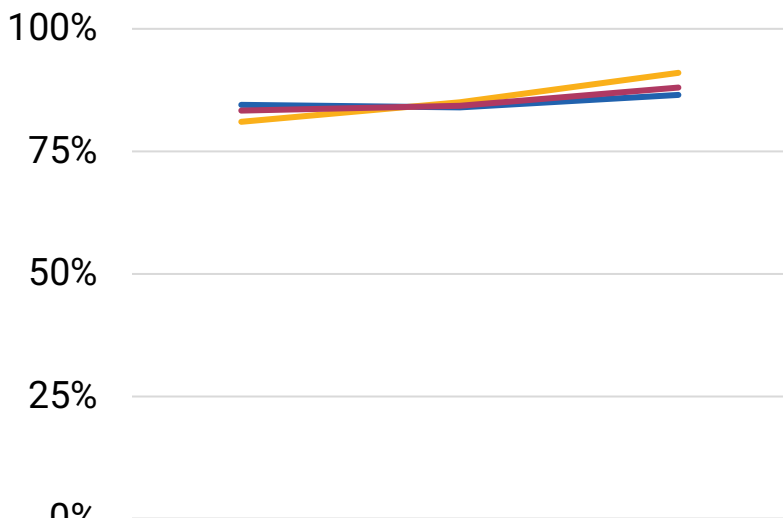


Present Danger and Protective Actions

Initial Assessment Case Review Results (2019 – 2021)

The first step of an Initial Assessment (IA) is to determine whether present danger threat(s) are identified at any point during the Initial Assessment process. The case review determines if this assessment was consistent with Standards.

When present danger is identified, the agency must take protective action, which could include a protective plan and/or Temporary Physical Custody (TPC).

Statewide, Present Danger assessments improved from 2019 to 2021. In 2021, 88.0% (264 of 300) of Present Danger Assessments were consistent with Standards (above).

From 2019 – 2021, 23.7% (214 of 900) IA's reviewed identified Present Danger. Protective Actions, which include TPC and Protective Plans, were taken on the majority of cases reviewed (right).

What protective actions were taken?
