Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On May 2, 2014, the agency received a report regarding a five-month-old child brought to the hospital with head injuries Medical professionals who examined the child suspected head trauma due to the child's presenting symptoms, so the child was transported to another hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries.
Medical personnel diagnosed the child with Physical Abuse-Abusive Head Trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother was arrested, criminally charged, and convicted of two counts of Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Great Bodily Harm.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother. Medical professionals determined the child sustained head injuries and diagnosed the child with Abusive Head Trauma. The child and her one-year-old sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On January 24, 2014, the agency screened-in a Services Report. The agency was providing the family with parenting services and other community supports to assist in the care of the two children. The agency's last contact was with the mother and the five-month-old child at a home visit which occurred on April 8, 2014.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother. Medical professionals determined the child sustained head injuries and diagnosed the child with Abusive Head Trauma. The child and her one-year-old sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
