On April 16, 2008, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child by the mother. A joint investigation was completed with law enforcement and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated; however, concerns of neglect and emotional damage by the mother were assessed during the investigation and were substantiated. The agency filed a CHIPS Petition and the family received Ongoing case management and the child continued to receive agency services related through a community services agency.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the mother and stepfather. The child was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The child was placed with her biological father and grandparents (who resided together). The mother and stepfather were criminally charged. The stepfather was court ordered to have no contact with the child. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed

	and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
