Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On November 1, 2016, the agency received a report regarding a 3-month-old infant brought to the hospital with significant injuries. Medical professionals diagnosed the infant with multiple fractures in various stages of healing. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the infant's suspicious injuries. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's alleged father was arrested and criminally charged with Child Abuse-Recklessly Cause Great Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the infant's alleged father. The agency also found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate neglect to the infant by the infant's mother. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained various bone fractures that were inflicted in more than one trauma event. The infant and the infant's 1 year old sister were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a licensed foster home. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing an August 1, 2016 screened-in CPS Report. The last contact with the infant's mother was a telephone call on October 6, 2016.

On August 1, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the 3-month-old infant by the infant's mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case remained open for ongoing case management services due to the unsafe finding regarding a November 1, 2016 CPS Report received during the open August 1, 2016 assessment.
