Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On March 7, 2017, the agency received a report regarding a 6-year-old child pronounced deceased in her home. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to complications from diabetes. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by an unknown malteater. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to complications from diabetes. The child's 2-year-old sister was residing in a licensed foster home at the time of the incident under a Consent Decree. There is a pending Child in Need of Protection and Service Petition before the courts. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the child resided with her maternal grandmother. The child's biological mother had regular visitation. The child's biological father's whereabouts are unknown. The child's 2-year-old sister was residing in a licensed foster home at the time of the incident under a Consent Decree.

At the time of the incident, the child's 2-year-old sibling was under a Consent Decree and placed in a licensed foster home. The last face-to-face contact by the agency to the mother was on March 3, 2017.

On September 27, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 2-year-old sister by her mother. The allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On February 26, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child's now 2-year-old sister by her mother. The allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On February 19, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse and neglect to the child's now 2-year-old sister by her mother. The allegation of physical abuse and neglect was unsubstantiated. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On March 21, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child by her mother. The allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Order was granted on March 24, 2014 to provide ongoing case management services, the order subsequently expired March 24, 2015.

On June 17, 2015, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 2-year-old sister by her mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case remained open for ongoing case management services.

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On February 11, 2013 the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On October 11, 2012 the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child by her mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was substantiated. The case remained open for ongoing case management services.

On April 22, 2011, the agency screened-out a Services Report.
