A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On November 28, 2005, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 17-year-old sister by an aunt. The allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the initial assessment.

On November 7, 2005, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On May 26, 2005 the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 17-year-old sister by the mother's significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On April 15, 2005, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 12-year-old brother by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The family was referred to community services, and the case was closed upon the completion of the initial assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The infant's 12-year-old and 10-year-old brothers were residing in out-of-home care under a December 3, 2014 Child in Need of Protection or Services Order at the time of the incident. The infant's 1-year-old brother was residing in out-of-home care under a May 5, 2016 Child in Need of Protection or Services Order. The case remained open under these orders to provide ongoing case management services.
