Medical professionals determined that the infant had been exposed to a controlled substance. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.				
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by both parents. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in foster care with her two siblings, who had a previous out-of-home care placement. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed on behalf of the infant and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
