Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On September 18, 2018, the agency received a report regarding a 5-month-old infant pronounced deceased in his home on September 17, 2018. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The official cause of the infant's death was Sudden Unexplained Infant Death. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by his father. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The official cause of the infant's death was Sudden Unexplained Infant Death. The agency determined the infant's 3-year-old and 5-year-old siblings safe with their respective fathers and the siblings remained with their respective fathers. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment and no service referrals were made.
