The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the infant's mother and father. The infant and her siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives and in non-relative foster homes. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
