Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office preliminarily stated that the death appeared to be from complications from an existing medical condition; the autopsy report is pending. No criminal charges were filed, and the case was closed.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the infant's mother and an unlicensed relative. The Medical Examiner's Office preliminarily stated that the death appeared to be from complications from an existing medical condition; the autopsy report is pending. The agency determined the other child living with the unlicensed relative to be safe.

in out-of-home care on June 25, 2022, after they were taken into Temporary Physical Custody due to allegations of physical abuse of the infant by an unknown maltreater.

At the time of the incident, the infant resided in out-of-home care with an unlicensed relative (her grandmother), grandfather, and 2-year-old sibling. The infant's mother had regular contact with the infant.
