The initial allegation of neglect by the infant's grandmother was unsubstantiated and the initial allegation of sexual abuse by a peer maltreater was substantiated.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father and neglect of the infant by both the mother and father. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The infant was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in a non-relative foster home. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
