Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:  On March 11, 2024, the agency received a report of an infant brought to the hospital with injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals noted no signs of trauma; the toxicology report was positive for controlled substances. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's significant other was criminally charged with 2 <sup>nd</sup> -Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety, Operator Flee/Elude Officer-Bodily Harm or Property Damage, Cause Injury/OWI (Passenger < 16 Yrs), and Violation of Child Safety Restraint Requirements-Child under 4 Years of Age. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.				
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals noted no signs of trauma; the toxicology report was positive for controlled substances. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by his mother and his mother's significant other. The agency deemed the infant and the infant's 2-year-old half-sibling unsafe, and they were placed with a relative under an existing Child in Need of Protection and/or Services dispositional order. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
