Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On December 9, 2024, the agency received a report regarding a 6-month-old infant who was found unresponsive in his home and who was later pronounced deceased. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the infant's death to be accidental. No criminal charges were filed, and the case was closed.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the infant's death to be accidental. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect or physical abuse by the father. The agency deemed the infant's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the mother and father were assessed as protective, and the infant's siblings remained with the mother and father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and the family was referred to community services.

At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing the October 26, 2024 CPS Report. The last contact by the agency was a home visit on October 28, 2024.

On October 26, 2024, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant and the infant's now 1-year-old sibling by the father. The infant died during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's death on December 9, 2024. An assessment of the initial allegations was completed by the agency, and the initial allegations of physical abuse were unsubstantiated.

On September 3, 2023, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 1-year-old sibling and neglect and physical abuse to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On April 10, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 21, 2022, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling by the mother and the mother's ex-significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
