Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On December 26, 2024, the agency received a report regarding a three-month-old infant who was found unresponsive and pronounced deceased on December 23, 2024. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant; the autopsy report is pending. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant; the autopsy report is pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the infant by the mother. The agency deemed the infant's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the infant's siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
