**Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:**

On June 21, 2025, the agency received a report regarding a 4-month-old infant brought to the hospital with head injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

**Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:**

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. The infant's half-siblings were deemed safe, and they remained with the mother. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed for the infant, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
