The agency worked with the family from January 2010 until November 2011. The agency substantiated physical abuse to the child by the mother and the children were determined safe in the care of the father. The agency filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition with juvenile court in March 2010. The family participated in services and the agency provided case management to the family until 11/8/11.

Summary of actions taken by the agency under ch. 48, including any investigation of a report or referrals to services involving the child, any member of the child's family living in this household and the child's parents and alleged maltreater. (Does not include the current incident.)

On 9/25/03, a report alleging inappropriate behavior by the father of the mother's 9-year-old and 3-year-old (now 18-year-old and 12-year-old) daughters was screened out.

On 10/17/03, a report alleging inappropriate behavior by the father of the mother's 9-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter was screened out.

On 11/12/03, a report alleging neglect by the mother and her then boyfriend (father to the 7-year-old and 8-year-old boys) to the mother's 10-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter was screened out.

On 2/13/04, a report alleging sexual contact between the mother's 10-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter with a male cousin approximately four years prior was screened out.

On 12/10/04, a report alleging neglect by the mother and father to their 11-month-old (now 8-year-old) son was screened in. Neglect was unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 12/15/04, a report alleging sexual abuse to the mother's 11-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter by her father and a male cousin was screened out.

On 12/15/04, another report alleging sexual abuse to the mother's 11-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter by a male cousin was screened in. Sexual abuse was unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 6/3/05, a report alleging inappropriate discipline to the mother's 5-year-old (now 12-year-old) daughter by her stepfather (father to the 7-year-old and 8-year-old boys) was screened out.

On 1/3/08, a report alleging physical abuse to the mother's 14-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter by her father was screened out.

On 2/1/08, a Services Report regarding visitation issues between the mother and the 14-year-old's (now 18-year-old) father was screened out.

On 2/13/08, a report alleging sexual abuse to the mother's 14-year-old (now 18-year-old) daughter by her father's friend was screened in. Sexual abuse was unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 5/8/08, a report alleging sexual abuse to the mother's 8-year-old (now 12-year-old) daughter by her father was screened in. Sexual abuse was unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 5/15/08, a report alleging neglect to the 4-year-old (now 8-year-old) by the mother was screened out.

On 8/4/08, a report alleging neglect to the 4-year-old (now 8-year-old) and 3-year-old (now 7-year-old) by the mother, as well as, sexual abuse to the 14-year-old (now 18-year-old) by her stepfather was screened in. Neglect and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 8/6/08, a report alleging neglect to the 4-year-old (now 8-year-old) and 3-year-old (now 7-year-old) by the mother was screened in. Neglect was unsubstantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 8/30/09, a report alleging sexual abuse to the 15-year-old (now 18-year-old) by her stepfather was screened in. Sexual abuse was unsubstantiated. The agency referred the family to community services and closed the case.

On 9/5/09, a report alleging neglect to the 15-year-old (now 18-year-old) by the mother was screened out.

On 9/8/09, a Services Report regarding the 15-year-old (now 18-year-old) requesting services for the family was screened out.

On 9/23/09, a Services Report regarding the grandparents seeking assistance obtaining guardianship of the mother's 9-year-old (now 12-year-old) daughter was screened out.

On 9/23/09, a report alleging sexual abuse to the 15-year-old (now 18-year-old) by her stepfather, as well as neglect to the 4-year-old (now 7-year-old) and 5-year-old (now 8-year-old) by the mother was screened out.

On 1/26/10, a report alleging physical abuse to the 4-year-old (now 7-year-old) and 6-year-old (now 8-year-old) by the mother was screened in. Physical abuse was substantiated and the agency opened the case for ongoing services.

On 4/20/11, a report alleging physical abuse to the 7-year-old (now 8-year-old) by the father was screened out.

On 6/21/11, a report alleging sexual contact between the 5-year-old (now 7-year-old) and a cousin was screened in. Sexual abuse was unsubstantiated and the case was already open for ongoing services.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency screened in and assessed the allegations of physical abuse and neglect to the children. Physical abuse and neglect by the father was substantiated. The children were determined unsafe in the care of the father and have moved to another county to live with the mother. The county where the mother currently resides filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition with juvenile court and the case remains open for court ordered ongoing case management services.
