Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On 12/8/12, the agency received a report of an infant who presented at the hospital with concerning lesions on his right foot at bilateral lower extremities which appeared to be possible burn injuries. Upon physical examination, the infant was found have red, fluid-filled bullous lesions present about the bilateral lower extremities below the knee as well as the right foot. The largest lesion was located on the right lower extremity, below the knee, and measured 5.2 cm at its greatest length and 2 cm its greatest width. There were additional lesions on all five toes on the infant's right foot, the lower half of the infant's right fo and the left, lower extremity. The infant's mother admitted to consuming beer, hard liquor, and marijuana the night before the infant was injured and to providing care for him while significantly impaired at the time he sustained his injuries. Medic personnel believe the burns to the infant's foot and legs were caused by the mother spilling hot liquid (namely formula, prepare by the mother in her impaired state) and the infant's foot being somehow immersed in the liquid while his sock was of Medical personnel believe the sock held the heat on the area, causing full thickness burns to his foot. During the course of the medical evaluation, it was recommended the infant undergo a head CT to look for evidence of intracranial injury and a skelet survey to look for evidence of recent or remote bony fractures. The head CT revealed a definite subdural bleed along the medical tentorium, most likely related to the same event as his burns. The skeletal survey was negative for any evidence of recent or remote bony injury. The mother was charged with criminal charges of endangering the safety of a child and found guilty of remote bony injury. Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. Neglect to the infant by the mother was substantiated. The mother admitted to consuming beer, hard liquor, and marijuana the night before the child we injured and to providing care for him while significantly impaired. The mother's impaired state placed the infant at great risk serious bodily injury. Based on the assessment of the mother's general functioning and parenting practices, the infant and he 3-year-old brother were determined safe in the home. The agency filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services petition juvenile court.

On 10/10/07, the agency screened in an allegation of sexual abuse to the mother when she was a minor by a peer maltreater. Sexual abuse by an unknown maltreater was substantiated and the agency closed the case.

On 2/4/09, the agency screened out an allegation of sexual abuse to the mother when she was a minor by a peer maltreater. The agency referred the report to law enforcement.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency screened in and assessed the allegation of neglect to the infant. Neglect to the infant by the mother was substantiated. Based upon the information gathered during the assessment, the infant and the 3-year-old were determined safe in the home. However, the agency determined the egregious nature of the incident warrants continued monitoring and services to ensure the welfare and safety of the children. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed in juvenile court for the infant. Juvenile court action is not being requested regarding the 3-year-old due to a protective plan adopted in the Family Court case brought by the 3-year-old's father, which specifically directs the mother's contact with the 3-year-old be monitored/supervised by family members and that she comply with the conditions ordered in juvenile court for the infant. The family continues to receive on-going case management services.
