Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On April 25, 2014, the agency received a report of a fifteen-year-old child who had injuries from a gunshot wound. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's injuries.

The mother reported on the day of the incident the father came upstairs and began to argue with her as he thought the mother had dumped his alcohol. The mother reported the father told her to go downstairs where he was going to kill her. The mother stated the children heard the father yelling and came downstairs to check on the mother. It was reported that the children saw the father had a gun pointed at the mother. It was reported that as the fifteen-year-old child struggled to gain control of the gun from her father, they fell over a dog gate, the gun went off and the fifteen-year-old child sustained a blister on her hand from the gun fire.

As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the father was arrested and criminally charged with five counts of 2nd Degree Reckless Endangering Safety and one count of Operating a Fire Arm While Intoxicated. The father was found guilty of two counts of 2nd Degree Reckless Endangering Safety and one count of Operating a Fire Arm While Intoxicated.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the fifteen-year-old child by the father. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate emotional abuse to the three children by the father. The father was criminally charged and court-ordered to have no contact with the three children and the mother. The agency determined the children safe and they remained with the mother. The family was referred to community mental health services and the agency closed the case.
