On April 21, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the three-year-old, two-year-old, and one-year old by the father. The children resided with their mother and the Initial Assessment was still open at the time of the current referral. The last contact with the mother and her three children prior to the incident was a home visit which occurred on May 1, 2014.

On April 21, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the three-year-old, two-year-old, and one-year old children. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse to the three children by the father was unsubstantiated.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by her mother. The mother failed to provide the necessary supervision for her three children. The mother was aware there was medication scattered on the floor that was accessible to the children; however, she failed to secure the medication. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the three children by the father. The child was deemed unsafe with the mother and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The child's two siblings, ages three-years-old and two-years-old, were also deemed unsafe with the mother, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
