Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On August 7, 2014, the agency received a report regarding a two-month-old infant pronounced deceased at the hospital. Law Enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation into the infant's unexplained death. The father reported he laid the infant down for a nap on her back and upon checking on her approximately one and a half hours later, he found her face down and not breathing. The mother and father then brought the infant to the hospital.

Preliminary results indicate the infant's cause of death was suffocation due her facial position in bed. The Medical Examiner's Office report noted no signs of significant maltreatment or trauma to the infant; toxicology results are still pending.

No criminal charges have been filed in this case, but the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the father or the mother. The Medical Examiner's Office report noted no signs of significant maltreatment or trauma to the infant. However, there were concerns in regard to the infant's quality of care and her unsafe sleeping conditions. As a result, law enforcement has continued their investigation into the infant's death. Due to this pending investigation, the infant's two surviving siblings, a three -yearold half-brother and a one-year-old sister, were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-ofhome care with relatives. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On October 2, 2013, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to a two-year-old child by the mother's boyfriend (current alleged maltreater and father to the infant). An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated and the child was deemed safe. The family was referred to a parenting program and the case was closed in initial assessment.

On May 23, 2014, the agency screened-in a Services Report. The agency made unsuccessful attempts to provide community resources to the parents.
