The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the father's live-in girlfriend. The agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate neglect to the child by the birth father and birth mother. Medical professionals determined the child sustained injuries and loss of weight from abuse.

The one-year-old child was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in out-of-home care. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remains open to provide ongoing case management services.
