Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On March 1, 2016, the agency received a report regarding a 4 month old infant brought to the hospital with head injuries. Medical professionals who examined the child suspected head trauma due to the child's presenting symptoms, so the child was transported to another hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries.

As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the infant's sibling was referred to the county juvenile services agency for further intervention related to the infant's injuries.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by his sibling; however, due to the sibling's status as a minor the allegations were unsubstantiated. The agency determined the infant safe, as the infant's sibling was removed from the home, and the infant remained with his mother and father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment and no service referrals were made.

On March 12, 2015, the agency screened in a CPS report for concerns of physical abuse to infant's now 13-year-old sister by her step-mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated and the children were deemed safe. The family was referred to community mental health services and the case was closed in initial assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The agency determined the infant safe, as the infant's sibling was removed from the home, and the infant remained with his mother and father.
