Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On April 29, 2016, the agency received a report regarding a 17 year old child brought to the hospital with facial injuries, as well as other injuries on her body. Medical personnel diagnosed the youth with non-accidental trauma. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the youth's suspicious injuries.

As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's boyfriend was arrested and criminally charged with Attempted 1st Degree Intentional Homicide, Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Great Bodily Harm, Aggravated Battery-Intend Great Bodily Harm, 1st Degree Reckless Injury, and Disorderly Conduct. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the youth by the mother's boyfriend. Medical professionals determined the youth sustained non-accidental injuries and she remained at the hospital for aftercare. Upon discharge she will be released to her mother who was assessed to be protective. The mother's boyfriend was criminally charged and remains incarcerated with a court order to have no contact with the youth. The family was referred to domestic violence and community-based services, as well as economic supports. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
