The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by an unknown malteater. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to complications from diabetes. The child's 2-year-old sister was residing in a licensed foster home at the time of the incident under a Consent Decree. There is a pending Child in Need of Protection and Service Petition before the courts. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
