At the time of the incident, the infant's four siblings were under Children in Need of Protection or Services Orders, were placed with relatives, and the family was receiving ongoing case management services from the agency. At the time of the infant's birth, the infant was taken into Temporary Physical Custody by the agency and was placed by court order in the home of her mother. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed for the infant and was under consideration by the court at the time of the incident. The last contact by the agency with the mother was a telephone call on July 7, 2017.

On April 11, 2017, the agency deemed the now 3-month-old infant to be unsafe, took Temporary Physical Custody, and filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition. On September 21, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse and neglect to the infant's now 18-month-old sister, and physical abuse to the infant's now 10-year-old brother by an unknown maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were substantiated for these children. The now 18-month-old, 10-year-old, 8-year-old, and 6-year-old siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with relatives. Children in Need of Protection or Services Petitions were filed for the four children on September 23, 2016 and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.

On June 4, 2015, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 8-year-old brother and now 10-year-old brother by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the initial assessment.

On May 14, 2015, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old brother by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the initial assessment.

On January 23, 2013, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 10-year-old brother, now 8-year-old brother, and now 6-year-old brother by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the initial assessment.

The Medical Examiner's determination of official cause of death is pending. The infant's 18-month-old, 6-year-old, 8-year-old, and 10-year-old siblings were residing with a relative under September 23, 2016 Children in Need of Protection or Services Orders. The case remains open under this order to provide ongoing case management services.
