Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On September 11, 2017, the agency received a report regarding 6-week-old infant pronounced deceased in his home. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation into the infant's unexplained death. The Medical Examiner's determination and toxicology results are pending. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother. The Medical Examiner's determination is pending. The infant's 6-year-old sibling was initially determined to be unsafe and the agency implemented a Protective Plan. The assessment completed by the agency subsequently determined the 6-year-old sibling to be safe in the care of her mother and the Protective Plan was terminated on September 22, 2017. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On November 12, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 6-year-old sibling by the mother. An Alternative Response Assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was determined to be services needed. The case was open under an Informal Disposition Agreement for voluntary ongoing case management services. Subsequently, the agency deemed the now 6-year-old sibling to be unsafe, took Temporary Physical Custody, and filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition. The court placed the now 6-year-old sibling in the care of a relative. The now 6-year-old sibling was reunified with her mother on July 29, 2014 and the case was closed on July 30, 2015.

On November 10, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 6-year-old sibling by the daycare provider. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was substantiated. The

case was held open under an Informal Disposition Agreement for voluntary ongoing case management services.

An Alternative Response Assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was determined services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On October 10, 2012, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 6-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
