On March 9, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report to assess for threat of harm of physical abuse to the alleged maltreater's biological children, as a result of the March 8, 2017 CPS Report alleging that an infant was physically abused in her daycare. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 8, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to an unrelated infant in the unlicensed daycare provider's home. The unlicensed daycare provider was named as an alleged maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was substantiated by an unknown maltreater. The unrelated infant's family received services and the case was closed.

The unrelated infant's family received services and the case was closed.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the unlicensed daycare provider. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The agency determined that the infant and the infant's 6-year-old brother were safe in their mother and father's care and they remained in the home with their parents. The unlicensed daycare provider was court ordered to have no contact with the infant and the infant's parents. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
