Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On February 10, 2018, the agency received a report regarding a 14-month-old infant who was pronounced deceased at by medical professionals. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's office determined the cause of death to be smoke inhalation; toxicology results are pending. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the infant's mother was arrested and criminally charged with two counts of Neglect and one count of Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death). A criminal charge is merely as allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The initial assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the 14-month-old infant and the infant's 4-year-old and 10-year-old siblings by the mother. The agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the children by the maternal aunt. The agency determined the infant's 6-year-old and 2-year-old cousins to be unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan using a relative care provider. The 4-year-old and 10-year-old siblings were deemed unsafe, taken in to Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in foster care with a relative. A no contact order was issued between the mother and the siblings. Children in Need of Protection and Services Petitions were filed for the infant's siblings, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

The family was referred to community support services, and the case was closed upon the completion of the Initial Assessment.
