The family was referred to community support services, and the case was closed upon the completion of the Initial Assessment.

The following history is related to the infant's maternal aunt, who was residing in the home at the time of the incident: On June 4, 2015, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The initial assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the 14-month-old infant and the infant's 4-year-old and 10-year-old siblings by the mother and the maternal aunt. The agency determined the infant's 6-year-old and 2-year-old cousins to be unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan using a relative care provider. The 4-year-old and 10-year-old siblings were deemed unsafe, taken in to Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in foster care with a relative. A no contact order was issued between the mother and the siblings. Children in Need of Protection and Services Petitions were filed for the infant's siblings, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
